Rose Williams, Luella Peltier, Glenda Swift, and Gail Cram attended a sports clinic at Chico High School where they learned many badminton techniques.

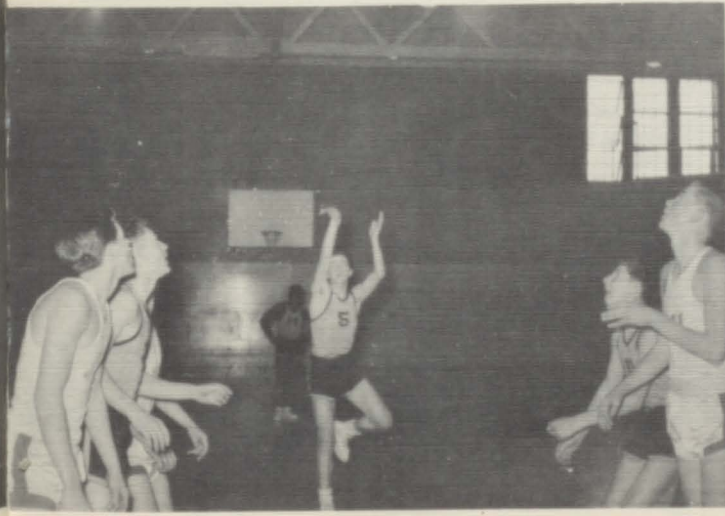
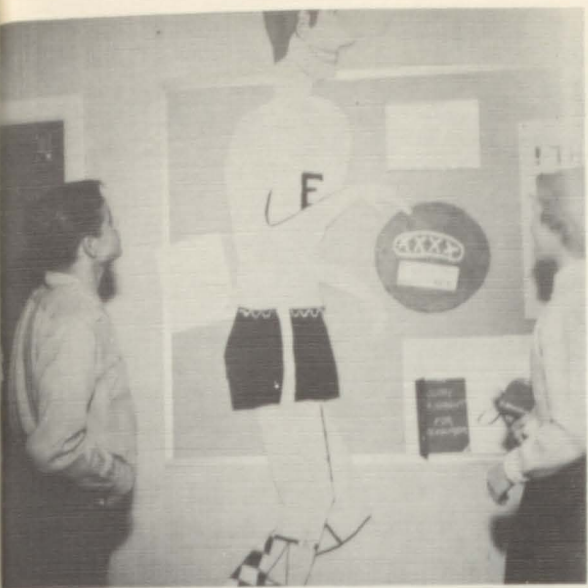

splendid turnout of more than a thousand interested citizens attended. Many inspiring speeches and entertaining music constituted the evening's formal program after which an open house was held.



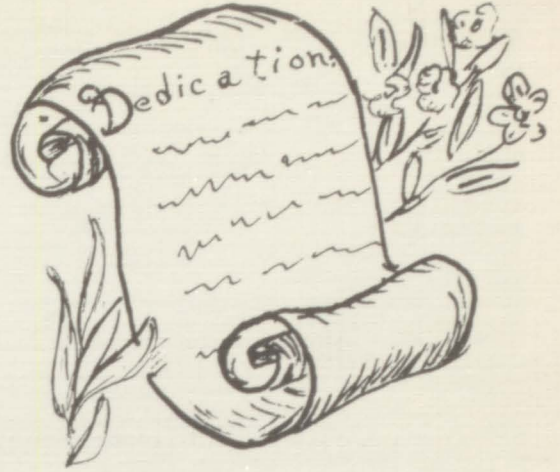

# SPRING GIRLS' SPORTS

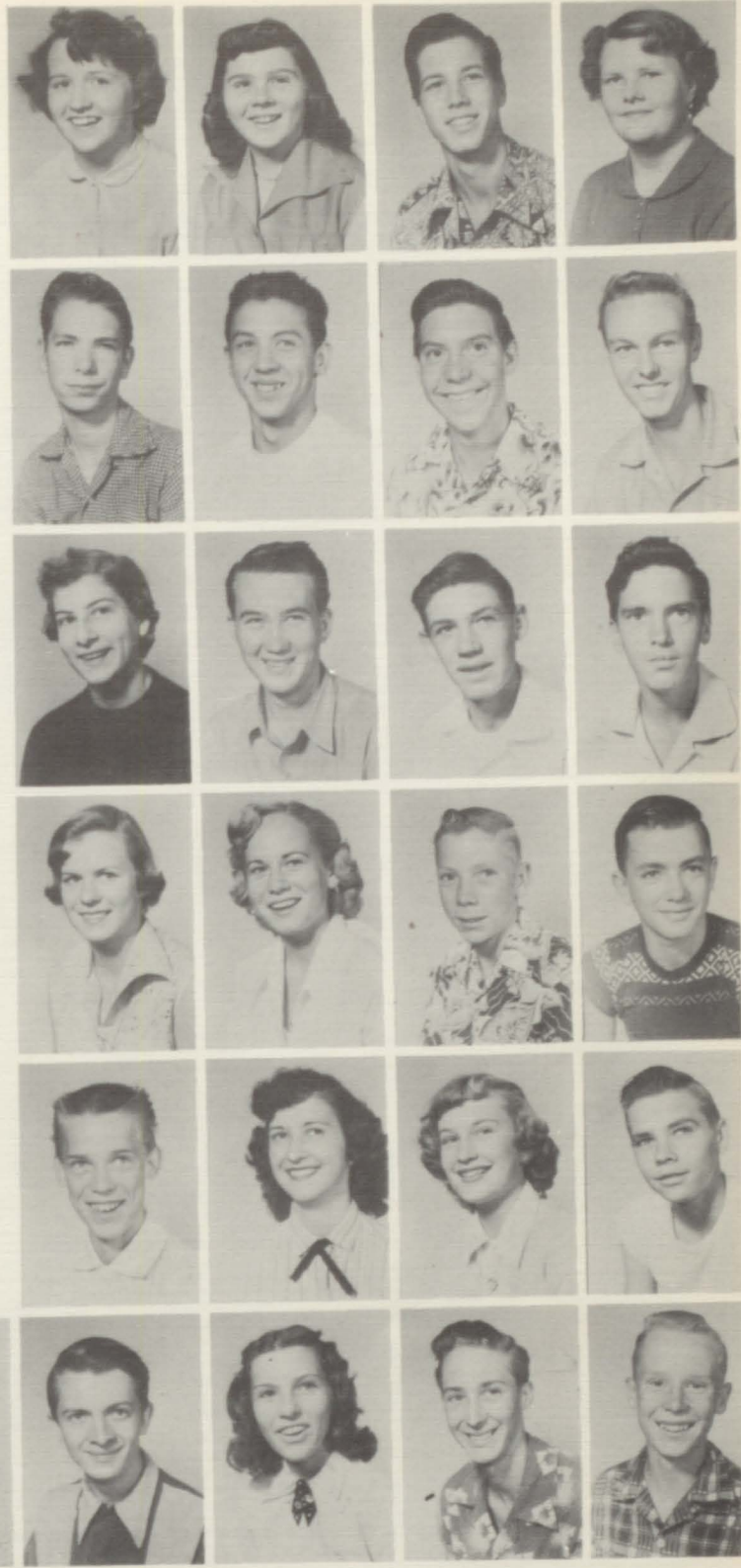
