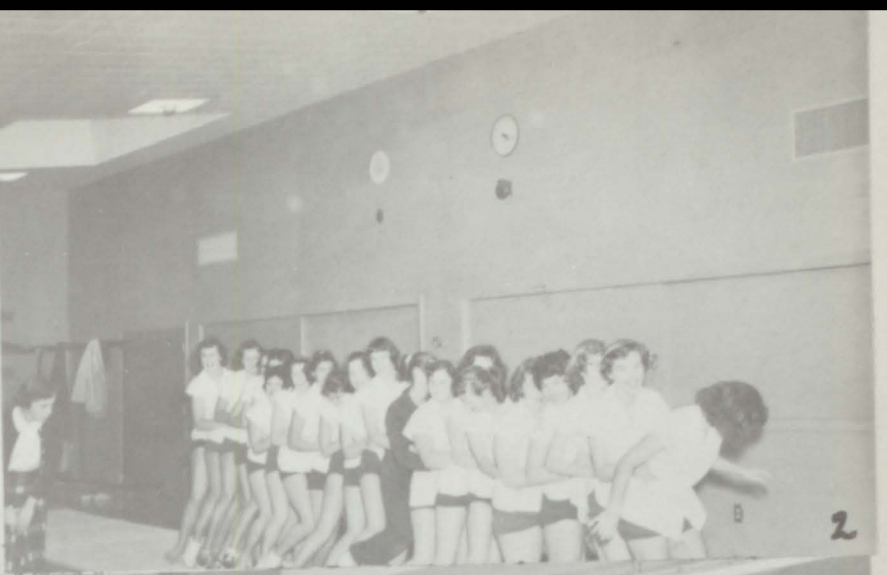
After volleyball came folk dancing in which members participated in foreign dances at a U. N. Assembly. The P. E. classes also played basketball and tumbled in the activity room.
